Community Action Plan for Darnall

Can it really be two years since we travelled around Darnall to different venues, gathering your views on the proposed community action plan? It is a ten year plan which aims to 'make Darnall a place where people want to live, have children and grow old'. The plan was the work of many partners, built up over a period of two years.

Our plan was accepted by Objective One and £500,000 was secured to deliver it, with just one little problem to be solved – we had to find another £500,000 as match funding before we could spend a

penny of the original money! But we managed, with the help of our partners again, not least Sheffield City Council's Regeneration Unit and Objective One themselves. The community plan has now been in place for the past 18 months.

The first project was to appoint a team to work up the plan, so two full-time and one part-time jobs were carefully filled.

The plan examined six themes, Education, Environment, Crime and Safety, Employment, Young People, Health and Social Care, and a theme group has been established as a think-tank around each topic. many useful projects have been set up. After a lot of hard work and hours sitting in meetings three of the themes – Education, Environment and Crime and

Safety.– now have a fully developed project.

Plans for the other three themes – Employment, Health and Social Care and Young People – are well on the way but still have to be appraised by Objective One before we can really start doing things.

The community action plan has an expected lifespan of ten years. We do not expect the Objective One funding together with the match money will be enough to meet all our aims and objectives, but once the initial project ideas being implemented we will see what further funding might be needed.

Darnall Green Spaces Project

We have decided to roll out the good work which has been carried out on High Hazels Park to other key local green spaces. Three people have been set on to develop a project to include High Hazels Park, Darnall Community Park, Kettlebridge (particularly the Myton Road site) and Phillimore Park. This project is known as the Darnall Green Spaces Project.

High Hazels Park

Work continues on High Hazels Park supported by the Friends of High Hazels who carry out practical tasks and help with fund raising. The most recent development has been the restructure of the Formal Garden which was opened in March.



Community Park and Phillimore Park

Both these parks are at the planning stage of development – consultation has been carried out by the team in both areas and master plans of both parks have been drawn up by the Environmental Consultancy at Sheffield University. Local consultations continue.



Activities and events have been organised on both parks to involve the community. There is an active group working on Phillimore Park but we still need some local people to come forward to support the work on Community Park.



Kettlebridge/Myton Road

The development on Myton Road was well established before the Darnall Green Spaces Project started and has been supported by the local community, East End Quality of Life Project and High Hazels Park Project. Funding for this project was secured by the group from Doorstep Greens and ? The space is now fully developed and the formal opening took place in August. If you haven't seen it I am sure you would find a visit to the site enjoyable.

Spread Your Wings

Based at Waltheof School, the Spread your wings mentoring project's main aims and objectives are:

- Mentor training accredited up to OCN Level 3
- Mentoring and Communication Skills up to OCN Level 2
- Year 10 pupils mentored on a one-to-one basis
- Training of a Co-ordinator to take the project on into year 2.

Pupils have gained in confidence from a 'listening and supportive ear'. The first three groups have completed successfully and many of the people involved have expressed a wish to continue mentoring or working in school on a volunteer basis with the hope of working in this kind of work.

The third group of Spread Your Wings have just completed their studies and mentoring at Waltheof School. The group thoroughly enjoyed the course and the fantastic effect the group had on the children mentored was immense.

So far 18 people have successfully completed the course and with a new group to begin in the Autumn more children will benefit.

Plans for tomorrow



Sheffield City Council have asked a firm of planners called Building Design Partnership (BDP) to come up with a "Neighbourhood Development Framework" for our area. This will form part of a long-term plan to improve Darnall

The first stage of the planning process is to ask the people of Darnall what they think about their area. Over the last few weeks well over a thousand local people have been involved, through a postal survey and numerous meetings

and drop-ins.

You told us that issues such as anti-social behaviour, the environment around your homes, refurbishment of older homes, and the provision of larger homes are all a high priority for you.

BDP will add this new information to the results of previous consultations and will devise a series of options. Darnall Forum will hold a number of events throughout late

September and early October to give you an opportunity to view and comment on these options.

Your views will then be used to decide which of the options are selected and taken forward for potential development. There will be another round of events throughout the area in late November to give you another chance to view and comment on the chosen options.
