

Workshops with two Darnall Youth Groups

Young people from the Phillimore Youth Group have been working with artist Amanda Wray to create a mosaic feature for Phillimore Park. The new mosaic is the first stage in developments to improve the youth area in Phillimore Park, and the group will be working closely with the Darnall Green Spaces Regeneration Project to make further improvements.

The Young Friends of Darnall Community Park and other young people have been putting their energy, skills and thoughts to good use by helping to design a youth shelter for Darnall Community Park. The young people made detailed sketches and 3D models of how they would like the shelter to look. Final designs are currently being drawn up and we hope that the Youth Shelter will be installed sometime in the summer.

Both groups were successful in raising the money from the Youth Capital Fund supported by Money Talks and Sheffield City Council.

Lord Mayor Returns Home to Present Awards to Trainees in Darnall

Trainees came together at the end of a series of employment courses organised by Darnall Forum for a ceremony at which the Lord Mayor, Cllr Arthur Dunworth, presented the awards and certificates. He was joined by Sylvia Hamilton, the Chair of Darnall Forum, and Brenda England from the Source Training Centre at Meadowhall. The qualifications gained by the trainees ranged from forklift truck driving to retail training and security guarding.

The Lord Mayor told the audience that, as a teenager, he had waited on Darnall Station for excursion trips to Cleethorpes. 'While the culture and the faith of some of the people in Darnall may have changed over the years since I grew up here,' he said, 'It is clear that the determination of

local people to improve their skills and work opportunities, and contribute to the success of Sheffield, has not changed at all. I commend all the trainees for their hard work in achieving these qualifications.'

He went on to say, 'Now that

organisations like Darnall Forum, Adult and Community Learning and The Source are making so many more training opportunities available, please don't let social barriers prevent you from pursuing whatever kind of work you want to do.

For instance, I would like to take this opportunity to encourage young women to consider forklift truck driving alongside their male colleagues. My Aunt, now in her Eighties, drove a crane during the Second World War, so I would encourage you to think of all the options open to you when you are considering what you want to do.'
